



Theme: Canada	Topic: Appreciating the Legacy of Glenn Gould
Stage: 2	CLB Outcome Level(s): 5 - 6

Task: Learners use various media to research the contribution of Glenn Gould to Canadian culture.

Estimated time for the task: 5 hours

Outcomes

By the end of this topic, learners will be able to ...

Speaking

- open, maintain and close a short routine formal conversation (6)
- give a set of instructions whose steps are not simply listed (6)
- make a verbal request for an item (6)
- participate in a small group discussion on non-personal topics (6)

Listening

- identify mood/attitude of participants (6)
- demonstrate comprehension of details and speaker's purpose (6)
- identify main ideas, supporting details in narrative and descriptive presentations (6)

Reading

- identify the attitude of the writer (6)
- follow written instructions not given in point form (6)
- find two or three pieces of information in moderately complex formatted texts (6)

Writing

- take notes from an oral presentation and a page of written information (6)
- write one or two paragraphs of a description or narration (6)

Language Focus Grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation

vocabulary: *soloist, piano concerto, tempo, tempi, unorthodox, conductor ,conception, performance, eccentric* and abstract adjectives to describe music and emotions

Developing the skills

To achieve the outcomes learners could ...

- 1. Warm-up Learners (est. 15 mins.):
 - listen to a few minutes of the 1981 recording of Gould playing Bach's *Goldberg Variations*
 - listen to a brief outline of Gould's career
- 2. Reading Task Learners (est. 45 mins.):
 - read "Glenn Gould" in *They Did It in Canada* and answer the comprehension questions that follow
 - read a glossary of unfamiliar vocabulary for the Task 3
- 3. Listening Task Learners (est.1 hr.):
 - listen to a recording of Leonard Bernstein's introduction of Glenn Gould at a concert in 1962 to hear the tone of voice and understand the gist. It can be found as Clip # 3 in the CBC Archives, broadcast Apr. 25, 1962.
 - listen again after reading the musical terms in the glossary
 - fill in the blanks of a transcript of that recording with single words while listening a third and fourth time.
- 4. Reading Task Learners (est. 1 hr.):
 - divide into groups to research the different sections of the CBC website: the *Archives*, *Arts Canada* and other links for more information
 - take notes on 10 items that show how gifted Gould was, and the extent of his contribution to Canadian cultural life
- 5. Speaking and Listening Task Learners (est. 1 hr.):
 - form new groups so that each member comes from a different group formed in task 4 and report their findings
 - comment on the most interesting, amusing or impressive facts
 - discuss as a class the importance of cultivating music in a culture
- 6. Final Task (Writing) Learners (est. 45 mins.):
 - write a paragraph to explain why Glenn Gould became famous
- 7. Follow-up Task (Reading) Learners (est.15 mins.):
 - find in newspaper listings of local classical music concerts
 - find the local station for CBC Radio 2 and the program guide on the CBC website
